The University of New Hampshire Counseling Center invites applications for a Program Specialist - Psychologist position beginning August 2017. We are seeking a psychologist with three or more years of experience including demonstrated experience in outreach, training and supervision as well as administration. This position is responsible for setting goals for, initiating, designing, coordinating and evaluating the outreach and assessment programs as well as maintaining, analyzing, and updating evaluation data of UNH Counseling Center Services. Demonstrated experience working as part of an interdisciplinary team in leadership, administration, and the provision of supervision are required. Interest and experience working in integrated care settings also highly valued.

Responsibilities:

Initiate, develop, implement and coordinate outreach and prevention programs to improve the quality of the campus learning environment, as well as programs that focus on at-risk groups based upon assessment results, including consultation with, and education and training of students, faculty, and staff regarding identifying, supporting, and referring at-risk students. Serve as consultant to faculty, staff and students on matters relating to the well-being of students, and to other programs. Provide individual and group psychotherapy, crisis and emergency on-call, case management, campus outreach, consultation and supervision/training of doctoral interns and postdoctoral fellows. Demonstrated experience working in mental health service provision at senior level. Provide emergency on-call for both day and night coverage. Ability to consult with faculty and staff around mental health issues.

Minimum Qualifications:

A doctoral degree in Counseling or Clinical Psychology, or equivalent, including a supervised internship, three years of experience in the mental health field. Eligibility for licensure as a psychologist in New Hampshire.

Seven licensed psychologists, five licensed social workers, three post-doctoral fellows, three doctoral interns, and three administrative assistants staff the Counseling Center. The Center is accredited by the International Association of Counseling Services, Inc. (IACS) and is a member of the Association of Psychology Internship Centers (APPIC).
